Supplies

- Two pieces of white paper
- One large colorful paper
- Coloring material
- Pencil
- Ruler
- Scissors
- Glue Stick



Instructions

1. Fold the white paper to create eight even sections and cut down the line in the middle.
2. Fold the paper to create a book with four sections.
3. Do this for both sheets of white paper.
4. Fill your folded books with art or a story, leaving the front and back cover empty.
5. Fold your large paper so there are two evenly sized flaps covering the center. Cut a design along the upper half.
6. Glue your white folded books to the inside of the large paper.
7. Title and decorate the cover.
