Supplies

- Plain background paper (the thicker the better)
- Magazines, newspaper, construction paper, drawings, photographs
- Glue
- Crayons, markers, and/or colored pencils
- Scissors

Instructions

- 1. Cut or tear your collage paper and begin to assemble the pieces onto the background paper.
- 2. Glue down your collage paper onto your plain paper, layering patterns and imagery.
- 3. Once your background is covered with collaged paper, use your crayons, markers, and/or colored pencils to create abstract designs over your collage.
- 4. Draw with a sharpie to highlight shapes or designs.
