

Rock Painting

Painting rocks can be fun for the whole family! And, you have the option to add a hide-and-seek component. The idea is simple: paint your rock, then hide it. Finders of painted rocks often post photos of them to Facebook rock painting pages, treasure them as keepsakes, and/or paint a new rock to hide. Popular hiding spots include parks, playgrounds, hiking trails, and even the beautiful gardens at RAM's Wustum Museum of Fine Arts!



Supplies

- Rock(s) to Paint
- Acrylic Paints
- Paintbrush
- Spray or Brush-on Sealer, if you plan to hide your rock outdoors

Directions

- Collect some rocks that you'd like to paint.
- 2. Wash your rock, so that it's a fresh canvas ready for paint.
- 3. Using a paintbrush and acrylic paints, paint your rock. Decorate it however you'd like, and be creative!
- 4. Once the acrylic paint is dry, you can seal your rock with a clear sealer to make your rock weatherproof. Spray sealers and brush-on sealers are sold at most craft and hardware stores.
- 5. If you like, you can hide your rock somewhere public for another person to find. The gardens at RAM's Wustum Museum of Fine Arts are a great place to hide and find painted rocks!
