Create a woven bracelet inspired by the jewelry of multimedia artist Tanya Crane using paper and other basic materials.

Crane, a Los Angeles native, creates work that embodies the many layers of human existence—specifically, history, race, class, and culture.

One of her pieces, a woven necklace entitled *Pangea*, was recently purchased for RAM's permanent collection and will be on display in the 2023 exhibition, *RAM Showcase: Four Jewelers and the Artist of Color Acquisition Fund*.

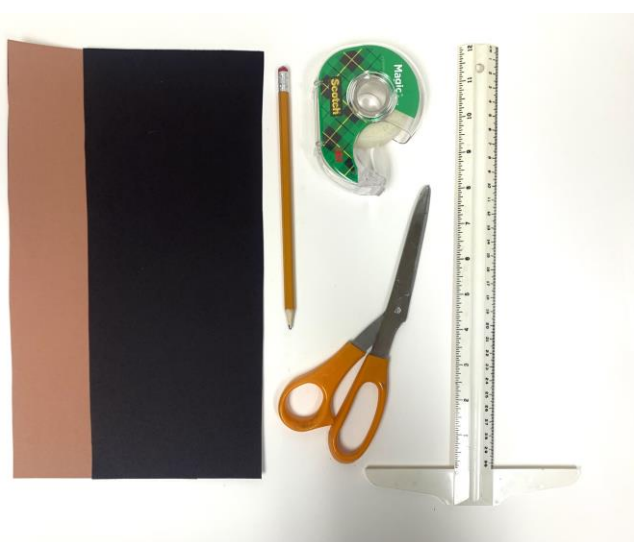

Supplies

- Two sheets of color paper
- Pencil
- Ruler
- Scissors
- Tape

Instructions

1. Cut the paper into one-inch strips.
2. Layer the strips on top of each other, one vertical and one horizontal, and tape them to the table.
3. Alternate folding the paper over each other.
4. Tape additional strips to the ends until the length fits around your wrist.
5. Secure the ends and tape them together.
