Supplies

- Cardboard Boxes (various sizes)
- Plastic Containers
- Various Found Objects
- Markers
- Paper
- Glue
- Tape
- Scissors
- Pencil



Instructions

- Collect waste materials like cardboard boxes, plastic containers, food wrappers, and spice bottles to create your project.
- 2. Layer your materials inside an open box or container to create a sense of dimension.
- 3. Use your art supplies to add color, texture, and design to the materials. Think of a fun, unifying theme for your assemblage, like this kitchen-themed project sample seen here.
- 4. Fasten the decorated pieces together with tape or glue, if desired.
