RACINE — The Racine Art Museum, 441 Main St., is one of five museums nationwide to host the first major retrospective of ceramic artist Karen Karnes. Open Jan. 29 through May 27, "A Chosen Path: The Ceramic Art of Karen Karnes" features 69 masterworks from this pioneering artist.

For more than 60 years Karnes has been at the forefront of the studio pottery movement. Over her long career, she has created some of the most iconic pottery of the late 20th and early 21st centuries. Karnes has worked in some of the most significant cultural settings of her



generation, including North Carolina's avant-garde Black Mountain College in the 1950s.

Karnes' artistic output is recognized for its understated, quietly poetic surfaces and sublime biomorphic forms. From her dramatic salt-glazed pottery of the 1960s and '70s, to

her most recent complex joined sculptural

pieces, Karnes consistently has challenged herself — with the unintentional consequence of irreversibly transforming the medium.

The Racine Art Museum is open from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Tuesday through Saturday, and from noon to 5 p.m. on Sunday. Admission is \$5 for adults and \$3 for youth ages 12-18, full-time students and seniors older than 62. There is no charge for children 11 and younger and to all on the first Friday of the month.
