Prize Winners Selected as Watercolor Wisconsin 2012 Marks 46th Year at RAM's Wustum Museum

On Sunday, December 9, RAM's Wustum Museum continued a splendid Racine tradition with the opening of *Watercolor Wisconsin 2012*. As one of the museum's most popular annual shows, this exhibition brings together the works of artists from throughout the state. Featuring 119 pieces by 86 Wisconsin artists, this year's show will be on view at RAM's Wustum Museum through April 27, 2013.

Of 287 pieces submitted by 163 artists, approximately onethird of the pieces were chosen for this year's show. During the opening reception Bruce W. Three new works were purchased for the Racine Art Museum's permanent collection, adding to RAM's holdings of extraordinary Wisconsin artists.

Docent led contemporary craft and architectural tours of the museums are available. Both campuses of the Racine Art Museum, are open to the public Tuesday - Saturday 10:00 am - 5:00 pm, and are closed Mondays, Federal

holidays and Easter. RAM is open Sunday Noon - 5:00 pm, while Wustum is closed Sundays. An admission fee of \$5 for adults, with reduced fees for students and seniors, applies at RAM. Admission to Wustum is free. Members are always admitted without charge to either campus.
