
"All In the Family" exhibit explores link between families and creativity

RACINE — An exhibit entitled "All in the Family: Featuring Kelly and Kyle Phelps" is on display through Oct. 4 at the Racine Art Museum, 441 Main St. This exhibition includes artwork by familial artists including couples, parents, children and siblings, and is drawn primarily from RAM's collection. "All in the Family" investigates the creative process and explores how shared environments might shape the creative process.

The centerpiece of the show is a concentration of collaborative sculptural work borrowed from emerging artists Kelly and Kyle Phelps, African-American identical twin brothers who create mixed media work that addresses the complex role of the middle class in contemporary

American society.

What similarities may exist generationally, as visible through works of art? Whether or not artists are creating collaboratively, it is interesting to consider
