

**RACINE** — The Monument Square Art Festival, one of Wisconsin's oldest juried fine art fairs, will take place Saturday and Sunday, June 11-12, on Monument Square, Main and Sixth streets.

The festival presents 70 artists from around the country exhibiting works in a variety of media including painting, photography, jewelry, textiles, sculpture, ceramics and mixed media. Live entertainment by area musicians will also be featured throughout the two-day event.

New this year, the Great Lakes Chalk Art Competition will feature 24 regional chalk artists, working on 4-feet by 4-feet Masonite panels positioned along Fifth Street between Wisconsin Avenue and Main Street.

# RAM's Wustum Museum celebrates anniversary with community exhibit

RACINE — As a celebration of the 75th anniversary of Wustum Museum, the exhibit "All About Wustum: Our Community Art Show" will showcase innovative artwork about Wustum by Racine Art Museum students, teachers and staff, as well as work by Racine Unified School District teachers and Racine Art Guild members. The show will remain on display through Aug. 13 at Wustum Museum, a campus of the Racine Art Museum at 2519 Northwestern Ave.

"All About Wustum" features pieces dedicated to memories and experiences of Wustum and its gardens, created by area families and art students. On view side-by-side with well-known regional artists who teach or work at the museums, the exhibition of 128 pieces includes a wide range of media that reflects the variety of different workshops and classes taught at Wustum.
