RACINE - The biennial exhibition, "Wisconsin Photography 2020," will be featured through Nov. 28 at Wustum Museum of Fine Arts, a campus of the Racine Art Museum at 2519 Northwestern Ave.

For "Wisconsin Photography," the selection process is similar to a portfolio review.
